10. Christmas

Clerk advised that the trees have been ordered and the donated lights have been reviewed with Mega. A barrier is required, to safeguard against small children from wandering into the area inadvertently as the donated lights are high voltage, and to mitigate against the new displays from Shangri-La being damaged. A temporary fence will be required and a potential option is green-coated mesh and iron rods as this should be quite robust but also easy to install, remove and then store.

Consideration also needs to be given to donating towards the cost of gifts for Santa to distribute on the night of the switch-on.

As part of the event will be taking place in the carpark to the rear of Canolfan Isa, consideration also needs to be given to assist towards the external lighting in the alley and over the carpark as they are not working and require maintenance work. Three quotes for the proposed work have been provided.

Resolved: To purchase 3 packs each of pins and mesh (based on 24m perimeter).

To accept quote of £1,165 to have new external lighting on Caffi Isa installed, on the basis that the Council funds the installation and maintains them on an ongoing basis, subject to Canolfan Isa providing the power supply to them.

PAC – New Brighton - formally object to this proposed development for the following reasons:

- It is named Bryn-y-Baal instead of New Brighton, where it is sited.
- The proposed development sits outside the settlement boundary.
- The proposed development is not on a site within Flintshire's LDP.
- The residences on Moorcroft already suffer significantly with surface water drainage, some residents having experienced their homes flooded with sewerage.
- 135 dwellings will create significant extra traffic on our already busy roads.
- There is already sufficient affordable housing in New Brighton.
- The sewerage system cannot currently accommodate 135 additional dwellings.

2. <u>Declaration of interests</u>

3. Concrete Slabs for bike stands/bench – consideration of costs

The Clerk advised that a site visit has been held with FCC, and quotations have been provided for a concrete slab to hold the bike stands and another for a new bench, to be sited on the junction of Mercia Drive and Mold Road, Mynydd Isa. The quotations were duly considered.

Resolved: Clerk requested to get at least one more quote, to compare.

4. Proposal to increase accessibility to Wats Dyke Park – consideration of costs

Clerk advised that, in response to an email sent by a resident and also to encourage active travel through Wats Dyke Park, a proposal has been suggested which will increase the accessibility to Wats Dyke Park. By law, there must be an accessible means of entry to the Park and there is one currently by Beech Grove. The proposed scheme would allow residents from the Bryn-y-Baal, etc easier access to the Park by making the existing gate accessible and dropping kerbs in an appropriate place.

Resolved: The proposed scheme of works to have the kerbs dropped and the existing gate altered was accepted.

5. Proposed scheme of works for new lighting in Sainsbury's carpark

Clerk advised that a scheme of works had been designed to create better lighting for Sainsbury's carpark in Mynydd Isa as parts of it can be very dark when night falls. The scheme is for lighting and a new path, but the work could be done in phases.

Resolved: Clerk requested to take Phase 1 of the scheme to the Council for consideration.

6. <u>Consideration of proposed response to PAC for 135 dwellings in New Brighton</u>
Consideration was given to the suggested wording drafted by the Clerk and some amendments were made as follows:

ACC wishes to formally object to this proposed development for the following reasons:

- It is named Bryn-y-Baal instead of New Brighton, where it is sited.
- The proposed development sits outside the settlement boundary.
- The proposed development is not on a site within Flintshire's LDP.
- The residences on Moorcroft already suffer significantly with surface water drainage, some residents having experienced their homes flooded with sewerage repeatedly.
- 135 dwellings will create significant extra traffic on our already busy roads.
- There is already sufficient affordable housing in New Brighton.
- The sewerage system cannot currently accommodate 135 additional dwellings and will need to be upgraded.
- No access to play provision
- Clarification is required as to where the foul pumping station pumps to.

Resolved: Clerk to submit the comments as amended.

7. Consideration of proposal to rejuvenate the central feature in the Memorial Garden Clerk advised that the gardening contractor has been invited to supply a quote to dig out the central feature in the Memorial Garden as it has become overgrown. If the area is dug out,

there is a suggestion that it could be then be planted up with biodiversity friendly planting and herbs for the community to use.

Cllr John Holiday volunteered to apply a stain to the benches. A braille fence to go round a sensory garden was also suggested.

Resolved: The proposal is approved, Clerk to look for grant opportunities.
